Old Business

President Overstreet summarized several conversations he has had regarding a left-turn lane into Lily Lake Grade School from Rt 47. Speaking with State Senator Syverson and State Rep. Keicher about this safety issue, neither had any positive suggestions to offer.

Kane County Sheriff Hain and Dr. Stirn at school Dist 301 have been helpful in gathering data to support a left-turn lane. Discussion on traffic cameras, traffic speed signs and other speed-calming devices took place. Rt 47 is an IDOT- governed route which leaves the Village no room to implement traffic devices without approval from IDOT. President Overstreet may investigate federal grants to aid in paying for the proposed turn lane in hopes that additional funding may help attain IDOT approval.
