### • Emergency Management:

Threats both natural and man-made are an every-day concern. The Village is working on purchasing and installing an Early Warning System, to be placed at the Simon Anderson Park on Empire Rd. This improvement is anticipated to be complete by the end of 2024.

### • New Ordinances for 2023:

### • Regulations to Remember:

- ❖ Street parking during snow events of an inch or greater is prohibited for the safety and efficiency of the plow.
- Parking within T-shaped cul-de-sacs is prohibited to enable buses and emergency vehicles proper access for turning.
- ❖ When clearing snow from your drive, do not push or shovel snow into the street.
- Signs, set-backs, and storage limitations, can apply to commercial zoned lots in different ways. To avoid a violation, please check the Village code for compliance regulations.

### Developments:

- ❖ The gas station at Rt 47 and Rt 64 has withdrawn their P.U.D. application and is moving forward with an expansion of their existing Filling Station. Under their existing B1 zone, they are planning to improve the store, add 6 more video gaming machines, improve the diesel fueling site to the east with 5-6 islands, and provide customer parking for 5-6 large trucks. Additional standard parking and a drive-thru lane around the north end of the existing store are in the works, in anticipation of a donut/coffee shop. Excavation may begin within the next few months. Please visit the convenient store and support this local business. The owners have made some great improvements to the store and surrounding area with more improvements to come.
- Construction continues with new homes and new neighbors filling the Trail Ridge, Sunset Views I & II neighborhoods. 6 new home permits were issued in 2023, and the year's not over yet!

### Clerk's Communication:

The Lily Lake Clerk and Deputy Clerk serve both as Official Clerks and Office Administrators to Lily Lake residents. Everything from Applications to Zoning issues pass through their office.

### Recipe Corner:

#### **Dave Anderson's Favorite Cookies**

Your current and newly elected Trustee David J. Anderson loves to cook. "I really enjoy making food for my friends and family. I consider sharing a meal a great act of kindness and love." He also strives to expand his cooking knowledge. As a self-proclaimed home chef Dave wanted to share his favorite chocolate chip cookie recipe. "I know everyone has a favorite and this recipe is mine. I'm not sure you can trust anyone that does not like chocolate chip cookie."

### **INGREDIENTS**

1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened

1 cup granulated sugar

1 cup packed brown sugar

2 large eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

3 cups all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon salt 2 cups chocolate chips



### DIRECTIONS

Preheat your oven to 375°F (190°C) and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

In a large mixing bowl, cream together the softened butter, granulated sugar, and brown sugar until smooth and fluffy.

Beat in the eggs, one at a time, then add the vanilla extract and mix until well combined.

In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, and salt. Gradually add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients, mixing until just combined. Stir in the chocolate chips evenly throughout the cookie dough.

Using a spoon or cookie scoop, drop rounded tablespoons of dough onto the prepared baking sheet, leaving some space between each

Bake the cookies for about 10-12 minutes or until the edges are lightly golden. The centers may look slightly underdone, but they will firm up as they cool. Remove the cookies from the oven and let them cool on the baking sheet for a few minutes before transferring them to a wire rack to cool completely. ENJOY!
