- **If you are interested in running for an elected position on the Village Board of Trustees, the following terms are up:**
 - (3) Trustee – Four year term
 - (1) President – Four year term
- **Village meetings currently are as follows:**
 - Public Works – First Wednesday of the month
 - Plan Commission – First Monday of the month
 - Board Meeting of Trustees – Fourth Monday of the month
 - (Meetings may change with conflicting Holidays)
- **File Election Packets at the Village Hall from December 10th -17th, 2018. Deadline is Monday December 17th. The Village will hold regular hours from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm, Monday thru Thursday.**

2018 Petition Guidelines for 2019 Consolidated Election:

Village Clerk will NOT notarize any filings for Village positions to avoid any appearance of impropriety.

All documentation must be filled out correctly; consult State of Illinois 2019 Candidate's Guide, State Elections Board, or legal counsel.

Ballot position is determined as followed:

- 1. All petitions filed by persons waiting in line the first day of filing before the office opens will be deemed filed simultaneously.*
- 2. Petitions filed by mail and received at opening in the office of the first day of filing will be deemed filed simultaneously.*
- 3. Ballot position for subsequent filings is determined by time and date.*
- 4. A lottery drawing approved by the State Board of Elections will be held for simultaneous filings to break any ties.*
- 5. Persons seeking assistance with filing of documents at the open of business on the first day of filing will not be considered to have filed at opening time for the purpose of a lottery draw for ballot position.*
